With the opening of the expanded Baylor Scott & White Cancer Center – College Station, patients can now continue to work, attend school and enjoy daily activities close to home while they receive lifesaving cancer treatment.

Comprehensive Cancer Care – All in One Place

Upon opening in January 2017, the \$6.1 million center expanded by 10,000 square feet, adding advanced radiation oncology services, including a linear accelerator, a CT simulator and a high-dose radiation therapy unit. This expanded on the existing chemotherapy, medical infusion and blood transfusion services, providing an integrated cancer model with all diagnostic, treatment and support services in a single location and with a single electronic medical record.

The cancer center delivers true multidisciplinary care from a team of experts working together to provide personalized treatment tailored to each patient's needs.

The cancer center on the Baylor Scott & White Medical Center – College Station campus is a modern facility enhanced by the exciting ideas of clinicians, researchers, patients, families, the community and others. Offerings include:

The Brazos Valley Food Bank began in 1985, striving for a hunger-free community by uniting our community to nourish neighbors in need. They promote education and understanding of hunger and inspire community involvement to help those who suffer food insecurity.

ABOUT THE BRAZOS VALLEY FOOD BANK BACKPACK PROGRAM

The Brazos Valley Food Bank's Backpack Program works to address childhood hunger by providing food to children at risk of going hungry over the weekend in 6 counties (Brazos, Burleson, Grimes, Madison, Robertson and Washington). Through the Backpack Program, bags of food are provided to partner schools during the school year and youth programs over the summer. Every Friday, the Brazos Valley Food Bank's Backpack partners distribute bags of nutritious, shelf stable food to children to ensure that they have access to food when school meals are unavailable. These backpacks provide children not only with needed nourishment, but also with self-confidence and a self-assured start to the school week. Twice a month the ladies of Junior League meet at the Brazos Valley Food Bank to fill these backpacks with food for the children to take home. Over the course of a single school year League members will stuff over 5,000 backpacks for children.

In addition to assisting with the Backpack Program, our League also assists the Brazos Valley Food Bank with their two annual events, Feast of Caring and KBTX's Food for Families Food Drive.

BOOKUP TX!

BookUp TX! is an after-school reading program for middle school students. During the school year 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students from the Boys and Girls Club of Brazos Valley meet with Junior League ladies to read and discuss a variety of books. In addition to reading together, they also play word games (Scrabble, Bananagrams, etc.) and do other fun activities to help engage middle school kids with reading. The books chosen cover a diverse range of genres, and the students are able to read stories they might not have ever been exposed to otherwise. At the end of each semester we take the students on a trip to Barnes and Noble where they can purchase books of their choice to start building their personal libraries. We have also taken the students to see movies that are based on books, which is a great opportunity to show how literature can look on the big screen as well as show the differences between reading and watching a movie. BookUp TX! has not only been beneficial for the students, but our League members say they learn a lot from the kids as well.

STUFF THE BUS

THE SIGNATURE PROJECT FOR THE JUNIOR LEAGUE OF BRYAN-COLLEGE STATION, INC.

A major initiative and the primary emphasis of Stuff the Bus is to provide school supplies to more than 16,000 school children in the Bryan and College Station area school districts. JLBCS, along with its gracious community partners, has distributed school supplies to over 165,000 students since the project's inception in 2000. Stuff the Bus is organized and managed from start to finish by members of our League, and the membership donates more than 2,000 volunteer hours between June and August to ensure the success of this project. Beginning in June, Stuff the Bus boxes are placed at various locations around town and community members are encouraged to make school supply donations. This year we made a big change with the addition of multiple drive days at various locations around town instead of one large drive day, and we had an increase in the number of supplies donated in addition to positive feedback from League members and the community! After the Stuff the Bus boxes are collected, the donated supplies are then tallied, sorted, and donated to each of the school districts. The positive impact Stuff the Bus brings to our local school children is tremendous, and JLBCS is honored to work with a community that ensures the success of this most important initiative. Our most precious resource is our children. By supporting Stuff the Bus and donating school supplies to this project, you can help insure our local children and families have a successful school year.

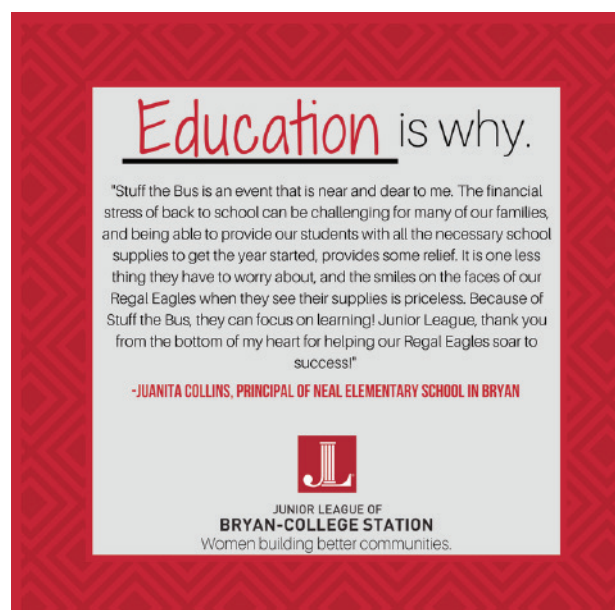


FORMERLY SUPERSELEERS SPONSOR RELATIONS COMMITTEE

FUTURE IMPACT GIFTS (FIG) WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Last year, during our 35th year of service, our League had the amazing opportunity to award two Future Impact Gift (FIG) grants in the amount of \$35,000 each to Family Promise Bryan-College Station and Scotty's House Brazos Valley Child Advocacy Center.

FAMILY PROMISE BCS

Family Promise Bryan-College Station, Inc. provides safe environments where children remain with parents during a time of homelessness. With funds from the FIG grants, Family Promise was able to enter Phase One to remodeling their facility, Hope Crossing, with new plumbing including sinks, showers, toilets, laundry units, etc. In addition to providing financial assistance to Family Promise, League members also spent countless hours volunteering with this organization and collecting supply donations for those in need of the services Family Promise provides.



SCOTTY'S HOUSE

Scotty's House was also one of our FIG recipients awarded during our 35th year of service.

"Scotty's House exists to provide safety, healing, and justice to local victims of child abuse and/or neglect. With the funds awarded by League through the FIG grant, Scotty's House was able to redesign and remodel the Forensics Wing, allowing Forensic Interviewers and Family Advocates to be housed in one area of the facility (not spread out). Having everyone stationed in one area allows for much better communication and efficiency among staff, thus being more effective to better serve the families affected by child abuse. We are truly grateful to be a recipient of the FIG, and appreciate everything The League does in our community - thank you!" -Cassie Medlin

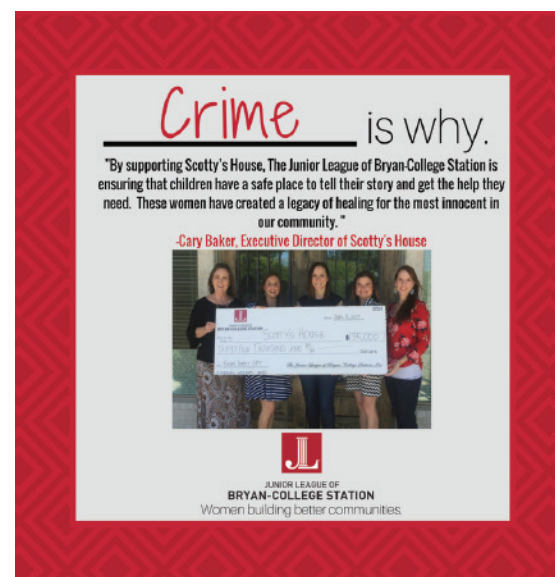

Raising over \$2,000,000 in its 36-year history, Charity Ball allows us the opportunity to fund our remarkable community projects and develop the potential of many women in our community. While this year's Ball may have been circus themed, it was run like a well-oiled machine. Jugglers, stilt walkers, unique décor, and The Royal Dukes Band brought the circus to life at this year's Charity Ball "Under the Big Top". Guests enjoyed an elegant night at the Hall of Champions at Kyle Field with delicious food and exciting performances. After dinner they had the opportunity to bid on fantastic items in the live and silent auctions. With the success of our Festival of Fun wine and liquor roulette at our 2016 Charity Ball, we brought it back this year and it proved to be a huge success once again. This year's raffle had two prizes for two different winners! The first winner received the David Gardner 36mm Datejust timepiece in stainless steel and white gold with a Mother of Pearl dial and flawless round diamond markers. The second winner received an 18k white gold 3-ring diamond band

designed by David Gardner himself specifically for our Charity Ball. It was made up of 3.32 carats of round brilliant & pear-shaped diamonds with the show-stopping center band made up of 2 carats of round brilliant cut diamonds. These items had a retail value of over \$30,000 and were generously donated by David Gardner's Jewelers. The Charity Ball Committee worked for months to create an event not to be missed. League members contribute to Charity Ball's success by being a member of a subcommittee, fundraising, decorating, donating, attending, and/or selling reservations or raffle tickets. Each year Charity Ball is truly a League effort and a wonderful way to socialize, fundraise, celebrate our success, and support our League's efforts to improve our community through voluntarism and leadership. All the efforts put into Charity Ball paid off, literally, with more than \$102,000 raised from the live auction, more than \$17,000 from the silent auction and Festival of Fun, and \$52,800 raised through raffle sales. "Charity Ball was a success because of the collaborative effort of our committee working together with PR, Board, Fund Development, Finance, Exec, and the many volunteer hours from Actives and Provisionals," said Ellen Moritz, Charity Ball Chair.

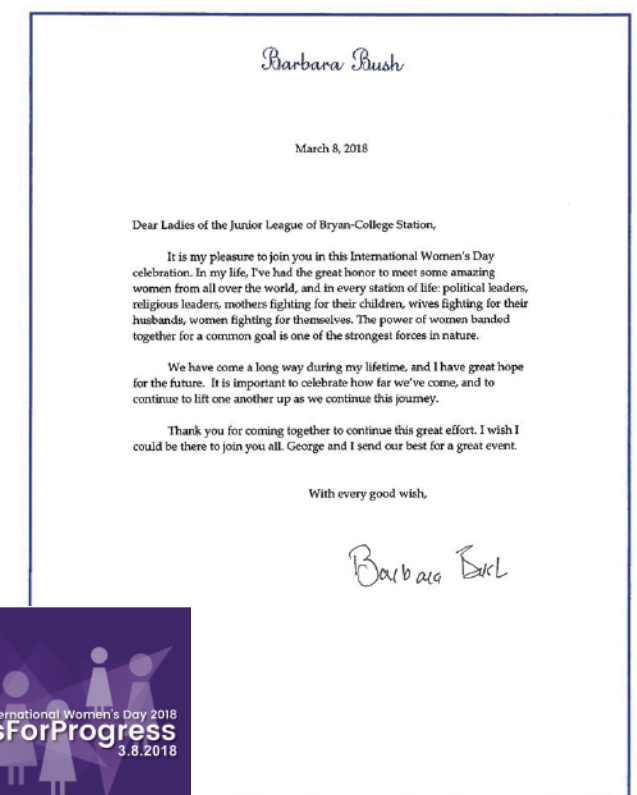

2018 BARGAIN BLITZ

BARGAIN BLITZ IS A TWO-DAY RUMMAGE SALE KNOWN THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY AS A BARGAIN SHOPPER'S PARADISE!

At Bargain Blitz, shoppers can purchase a large variety of new and gently-used merchandise donated by local businesses, local community members, and Junior League members. Preview Party is held the Friday evening before the sale on Saturday.

At Preview Party, attendees get a “sneak peek” at the merchandise and a chance to buy items at double the sticker price. The annual Bargain Blitz fundraiser doubles as a service to the community and has contributed over \$400,000 to support our Mission of improving our community!

Members of the Bargain Blitz Committee spend months overseeing the collection, storage, pricing, and selling of Bargain Blitz merchandise. Bargain Blitz is held the first weekend of March each year at The Expo Center in Bryan.



This year's Bargain Blitz saw a large number of people in attendance on both nights. We welcomed many guests at our Preview Party on Friday night and even more shoppers on Saturday. Overall, we were able to raise over \$25,000 that will go back into our community projects next year.

The preparation takes a lot of hard work, but in the end it is worth it when we see families going home with “new” items for their families. Whether it is a bicycle, a bed for a child who didn't have one before, toys, a wedding dress, or stacks of books- we are grateful that we have the opportunity to help individuals find what they are searching for. 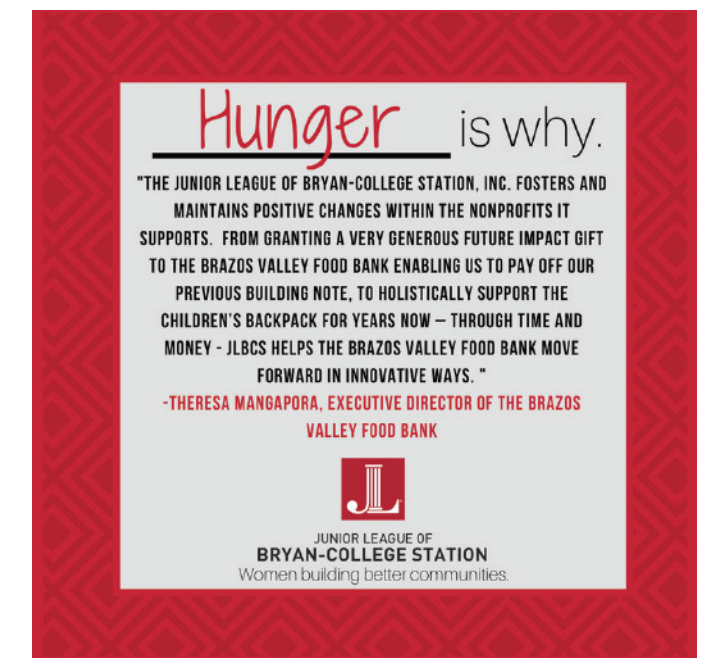
