A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear Junior League Members, Partners, and Friends,

For the first time in the history of the Junior League of Bryan-College Station, our League has completed an entire year in a global pandemic. No one was quite sure how the year would shape up. It has been a year of virtual meetings and cancelled events. But it's also been a year of new possibilities and reimagined opportunities. We as a League didn't focus on what we couldn't do. Rather, we saw the limitations as challenges--and we rose to the occasion.

Our Junior League theme this year was (re)engage. It was a call to action for our members to (re)engage in the community and to (re)engage in themselves. For the first time, every member in the League had the opportunity to support our year long partner, the Ronald McDonald House Charities. When members weren't able to volunteer in the hospitals pushing the Happy Wheels Carts, our community projects committee worked with the Ronald McDonald House Charities to identify several projects our members could do at home. These support projects included collecting pop tabs, making blankets, crafting cards and knitting hats for newborns to name a few.

As part of our League's mission to develop the potential of women, our focus on (re)engaging members was evident through the personal and professional development sessions hosted by our member engagement committee. This newly formed committee provided education and

training sessions on etiquette, communication as well as community services--all so our members could grow and be better informed members of our community.

While our League year certainly didn't turn out the way anyone expected, no one started the League year thinking anything would stay the same. Our success this year proved the Junior League of Bryan-College Station will find a way to succeed despite the circumstances. Our members showed perseverance, determination and grit. Their efforts paid off.

The Junior League has been part of the Bryan-College Station community for almost 40 years. During the pandemic, we gave 20,000 grant dollars to organizations in need, pivoted our annual ball to a virtual fundraising event that raised over \$120,000, and launched a new community project called Project (re)engage that supported over a half dozen organizations. Now, more than ever, our organization is proud of the impact we've made. But we're not able to make this impact alone. Thank you to our community partners and sponsors for helping us support our community when they needed it the most. We're excited to continue to (re)engage and we look forward to another 40 years of giving back to Bryan-College Station.

COMMUNITY

The Community Grants Committee researches, develops, and conducts the review process for community projects, short term grants, and "Done in a Day" events. During the 2020-2021 Junior League year, Community Grants awarded over \$20,000 in short term grants to provide assistance to College Station Education Foundation, Amber Alert Network Brazos Valley, BCS Together, Becky Gates Children's Center, Bridge Ministries, Brazos Valley Worldfest, Project Hope Clothing Closet (Bryan ISD), Catholic Charities of Central Texas, Mary Branch Elementary (Bryan ISD), Navarro Elementary (Bryan ISD) and United Way of Brazos Valley.

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES

A few times per month, Junior League volunteers assist with the Ronald McDonald House (RMHC) at local hospitals in the Bryan-College Station community. The RMHC delivers comfort and care items directly to families as they sit in waiting rooms and by their child's bedside. These carts - wheeled by Junior League volunteers from room to room - provide snacks, toys, games, and personal hygiene items to patients and families staying in the hospital. This allows them to stay where they are needed most without having to leave to get food, toiletries, and other commonly needed items. During December the Junior League donated 25 bags of necessities to the families staying at RMHC at Christmas. COVID-19 limited the amount of support Junior League could provide in the hospitals. Through close collaboration with RMHC and Junior League, several projects that could be completed by volunteers at home were identified. The committee hosted a Pop Top Drive to collect soda pop can tops. The tops could be turned into Bryan Metal and Recycling by RMHC for funds. Committee members also hosted collection drives throughout the year to gather greeting cards to give to families, activity packets for siblings and linens such as masks and blankets for children.

THE SIGNATURE PROJECT FOR THE JUNIOR LEAGUE OF BRYAN-COLLEGE STATION, INC.

A major initiative and the primary emphasis of Stuff the Bus is to provide school supplies to more than 10,130 school children in the Bryan and College Station area school districts. League, along with its generous community partners, has distributed school supplies to over 200,000 students since the project's inception in 2000. Stuff the Bus is organized and managed from start to finish by members of League, and the membership donates more than 2,000 volunteer hours between July and August to ensure the success of this project. Beginning in June, Stuff the Bus school buses are placed at various locations around town and community members are encouraged to make school supply donations. After the Stuff the Bus boxes are collected, the donated supplies are then tallied, sorted, and donated to each of the school districts. The positive impact Stuff the Bus brings to local school children is tremendous, and Junior League is honored to work with a community that ensures the success of this important initiative. Junior League recognizes the community's most precious resource is the children. Community members' support of Stuff the Bus and school supplies donations ensure the local children and families have success in school year after year.

2020 STUFF THE BUS IMPACT

In 2020, The Junior League of Bryan-College Station, Inc. purchased \$110,000 worth of supplies for elementary and intermediate schools of the Bryan Independent School District (BISD) and the College Station Independent School District (CSISD). Over the multi-day supply drive, League successfully brought in 40 banana boxes full of school supply items to benefit elementary and intermediate children in both the Bryan and College Station independent school districts.

In addition, JLBCS collected **247 backpacks full of supplies** from area dentists hosted by Brazos Valley Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery Center and **1,245 packages** of school supplies from HEB.

During the three drives held at all Blue Baker locations August 5 through August 7, approximately **\$5,300** in monetary donations was collected. The funds and supply donations will support next year's project.

RAISING OVER \$2,000,000 IN ITS 38-YEAR HISTORY, CHARITY BALL PROVIDES THE FINANCIAL RESOURCES TO SUPPORT THE MANY REMARKABLE COMMUNITY PROJECTS WHILE DEVELOPING THE POTENTIAL OF LEAGUE MEMBERS.

Due to COVID-19, Junior League's largest fundraiser looked a little different this year when the first ever virtual fundraising event was held on Saturday, December 12, 2020. Reimagined as A Night of Giving, the event was a live broadcast featuring local entertainment by Brazos Valley TROUPE, Bryan High School Cheerleaders, Expressions Dance and Music, Tradicional Mosqueda and Dancing Jaguars. The event was hosted by Rusty Surette and Karla Castillo along with the Charity Ball Committee. The broadcast also featured our prominent sponsors and stories that highlighted the impact the Junior League of Bryan-College Station, Inc. has made on the community. Event "guests" were invited to enjoy a "Party in a Box" full of treats and eats as they watched the festivities and bid on silent auction items.

Even though Charity Ball could not take place in its traditional format, A Night of Giving truly was a League effort. The event was a wonderful way to socialize, fundraise, celebrate collective success, and support Junior League's efforts to improve the community through voluntarism and leadership. The raffle and silent auction brought in \$93,404, and because of the tremendous effort of the Charity Ball committee and Junior League members, over \$167,000 gross was raised to benefit the children and youth of the Bryan-College Station community!

DUE TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CONCERNS RELATED TO COVID-19, THE JUNIOR LEAGUE MADE THE TOUGH DECISION TO CANCEL BARGAIN BLITZ FOR 2021.

In the absence of Bargain Blitz, it was important that the Junior League still find a way to give back to the community. Playing off the theme for the year, Project (re)engage was created to reaffirm the Junior League's goal of serving the community. The Bargain Blitz committee reached out to community partners to determine what needs the Junior League could help fill.

In just a few months' time, the Bargain Blitz committee identified 6 organizations that could use the help of the Junior League. The project committee organized collection drives for in-demand items such as canned food, toiletries, baby clothes, diapers, books, and games. Despite not being able to hold a long-standing community event, Bargain Blitz, the Junior League didn't pass up the opportunity to help the community when and how they needed it most.





NEW MEMBER CLASS 2020-2021




